A group of 40 young musicians, youth workers and facilitators from 6 countries united and strengthened international solidarity through the EU Erasmus+funded project, WEMusic, providing a safe music environment for ALL! Five-day program with various activities, music marketing, jam sessions, intercultural nights, friendships, visits to historical sights, delicious food, and much more.

We tried to feel and understand Tunisia, one of the northern African republics, in May 2023, in the city called Hammamet.



Tunisia, thanks to CCAB, offered us so much in just a few days. Unique cultural and historical stories, concerts with some of the most famous Tunisian musicians in the venues of the CCAB in Tunis, the incredible visit of Sidi Bou Said, much food, laughing and genuinely unique genres of music from around six countries during the second activity *in situ* - youth mobility - of WEMusic project! The participants got a chance to learn more about pitch methods that can be used to attract potential supporters in their local, national, regional and transnational music environment, how to use the possibilities to promote their content with a broader number of followers and to create a more robust music network for all. 
